HOW TO TAKE PART

- Take two pictures of yourself with your written, illustrated, or translated book.

 All kinds of genres of books are welcome novels, comics, translations, memoirs, non-fiction, plays, poetry, short stories, picture books and even manuscripts in the making!
- The first picture is with the open book in front of your face, and the second with your face visible → → →
 Post the two pics together on World Book

A bit background Many debates on the policy level are about « sectors » or « the book industry» – but those with whom the book chain begins are individuals, people, personalities. To praise and celebrate these authors, writers, illustrators and translators, to make the spirits, minds and faces behind every book visible, to put authors on stage, is the basic idea of #behindeverybook.

Why the 23 of April?

The annual UNESCO event World Book Day is the original idea of the Valencian writer Vicente Clavel Andrés to honor the author Miguel de Cervantes, who died on 23 April.

On this day we praise the living authors, who enrich every society with their work and contribute to diversity, democracy, and humanitarian education in all areas, within all genres.

Some facts, figures and details of #behindeverybook in 2022:

- the hashtag #behindeverybook reached 1.1 Million Twitter, Facebook and Instagram users and led to 2800 interactions (retweets, likes, comments)
- the Instagram-posts can be found here: https://www.instagram.com/explore/tags/behindeverybook/
- the profile of European Writers' Council reached 6000 views and visitors on Twitter
- the most used languages: English, German, Italian, Spanish
- we spotted writers, translators and illustrators from Austria, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Norway, Portugal, Romania, Spain, Slovenia, the Netherlands and United Kingdom. And one from Canada
- most popular backgrounds: pure nature, flowers, mountains, book shelfs, living rooms
- most popular animal companions: dogs, horses, cats, ant bears
- noticeable increase in translators as well as female writers, and a lively participation also from visual artists for children's books
- most frequently used hashtags together with #behindeverybook#paythewriter

We hope that #behindeverybook will continue to develop over the coming years to put a spotlight on the writers, translators and visual authors behind every book.
